These datasets are used to quantify the skills and cognitive demand needed for someone to be successful at work.

The tool enables users to quickly identify job tasks so that return to work (RTW) and modified duty expectations can be set using data-driven information.

Job titles and job classes are also integrated into the MDGuidelines *Duration Views* tool to help users quickly find the optimum recovery duration based on physical work requirements.

- Enter a job name or keyword to find information on more than 13,000 job titles.
- Learn about the physical and mental demands required to be successful at the job (including sedentary, light, medium, heavy, or very heavy work). Then link the job title to the diagnosis to review the expected duration of recovery.
- Look up information about thousands of jobs, including verbal abilities, fine motor skills, endurance, as well as specific vocational requirements.
